Ralph and many of his volunteers stocked fish on May 1.



CO OP NURSERY NEWS

Hello from the Union County Sportsmen's Club Co Op Nursery. We are enjoying a wonderful stretch of beautiful weather here in the Weikert area. Hopefully, you are doing the same in your locale. The UCSC Co Op had an up and down year of raising trout.



Let's start with the bad news. Things were going well until one of the many strong storms we had this spring blew in and dumped 3½ inches of rain on the nursery. Our feeder stream rose quickly and got muddy. The resulting sediment-packed water created an oxygen grab, and we lost about 700 12-inch rainbows in one evening.

Now for the good news. In early April, we purchased some 18 to 20-inch tagged trout and stocked them in Laurel Run and Penns Creek. Several tags were turned in to the Club for a gift certificate. Some of those hogs are still out there patrolling the depths of the nice holes in Penns. On May 1, we stocked close to 1,900 fat healthy rainbow trout in Penns Creek and Laurel Run. The Club kept 220 rainbows and goldens for our annual kid's fishing derby. Over 120 youth showed up on May 10 and had an outstanding

day of fishing, food, and family fun. Our derby was followed by the Union County Sheriff's Department bike rodeo. Once again, a great time was had by all. Thank you to A.B.A.T.E., the Union County Sheriff's Department, and all the Club's volunteers who make this day a highlight of our schedule every year.

Next year's fingerlings arrived from the PFBC on June 24. We received 2,900 rainbows and 50 goldens. After an early bout of the gyro parasite and the loss of 70 trout, our fish have been doing well. The rainbows are averaging about 7 inches, and some of the goldens are pushing the 9-inch mark already. Most of these fish should be in the 12 to 14-inch range when we stock them next year in early Mary.

As usual, the Club will stock some trout from Cedar Springs Hatchery this fall. Our target date is the middle of October, but this depends on water levels. Last year it didn't happen until mid-December. Check with the Club for updates.

Penns has been running pretty low lately. On the morning of writing this letter, the creek was at 124 cfs. Hard to believe after all the rain we had in May and June. Check out the USGS Penns Creek site to stay updated on water levels. Hopefully we get some decent precipitation, and the trout fishing will be good this fall.

Oh yeah, one more thing. If you're up this way to fish, hunt, or just enjoy the area, make sure you stop at the Club for a sandwich and a beverage. You might as well buy a trout pin or two while you're at it. See you on the creek.








our Penns Creek fly patterns. All are welcome to attend. The Club provides the morning coffee and lunch. Hope to see you there!




